- 4. After you log in, hover over your name and you will see "Quick Links". Below that you will see:
- a. My SCBA

- c. Update My Information
- d. Update My Committees
- 5. Click on My CLE History, you will see the courses you have attended. Off to the right side you will see the Icon for certificates. You are now able to download the certificate, print it or save it. You may go to your history and review the courses you have taken in any given year!
- 6. **CLE certificates will no longer be mailed or emailed.** Certificates will be available within 10 days after the course.

 - Reviewing Today
- Education Benefits
 - Post 9/11, Voc Rehab
- Home Loan
- Allowances
 - Aid and Attendance, Housebound
- Death Benefits
 - Connected/Non-connected, Presidential Certificate, Cemeteries (Calverton)
- State Benefits
 - Property Tax, Retirement, etc.

Recent Changes in Veterans Law

- Family Caregiver Program
- VA Comments
 - Mental Health, Sleep apnea, Tinnitus
- Burn Pit Presumptive Conditions
 - Asthma, Rhinitis, Sinusitis
 - Proposed larynx, trachea, etc. cancers

Initial Claims

- Attorney/VSO
 - VA Accredited
 - Knows what they are doing
 - VA 21-22a
 - Take the burden off yourself!
- Intent to File
- Disabilities are legislated
- Ratings/symptoms are legislated
- VA Duty to assist
 - Good luck

Initial Claims

File Claim

- Medical Records
 - Service, VA, private provider
- Statements
 - · Personal, witness, doctor's, providers
- Awards
 - Purple Heart, CAR/CAB, commendations

Dependents

- Spouse, children, parents
- VA 21-686c

Process Claim

- C&P exams
 - VES/LHI
 - 3d Party
 - · When you are limited vs. as far as you can go
 - DBQs
- Paperwork
 - VA losses paperwork
 - VA does not always review and contact you

Process Claim

- What to claim and how many claims.
 - Everything you rate
 - 4 claims vs. everything

Process Claim

- Who is reviewing my claim?
 - Claims Examiner.
 - Do not assume anything.

Appeals

- Modernization of Appeals
 - Supplemental Claim
 - Higher-Level Review
 - Board of Veterans Appeal (BVA)
 - Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims (CAVC)
 - Federal Circuit
 - Supreme Court

Supplemental Claim

- Add more evidence
- Statements
- Medical Records
- Timeline
 - 3-6 months

Higher-Level Review

- VA Form 20-0996
- More experienced examiner
- No new evidence, generally
- No hearing
- Timeline
 - 6 months

BVA

- VA Form 10182
- Petition
 - Barney Style
- Evidence
- Hearing with BVA "Judge"
- Ruling after the fact
- Timeline
 - 6-9 months

CAVC

- Petition
- Hearing in front of panel of Judges
- Federal Court
- VA argues
- "Highest" VA Court
- Timeline
 - Years

Federal Circuit

- Same style as CAVC
- Rare
- Timeline
 - More years

Supreme Court

- Extremely Rare!
- Same style as previous
- Timeline
 - Year or not at all. No guarantee

Examples

- Direct vs. Presumptive conditions
- More common claims
 - PTSD, TBI, tinnitus, sleep apnea, back conditions, pain
- VA Decision Letters
 - Common sense does not apply
- You know your case.
- TDIU vs. Total and Permanent
- Scenario

Reservists

- VA Pay and Military Pay
 - Cannot collect both
- DES as a reservist
 - VA and DOD do talk to each other.
- DES comes into play?
